### Program

Prior to our program speakers Lion President Chris Brooks presided over the formal induction of four new Lions into Lionism (six were originally scheduled, but two were unable to be with us, tonight). These four were Lion Jimmy Horton, sponsored by Lion Steve Rogers; Lion Quinn Jackson, sponsored by Lion Milton Parrish; Lion David Peacock, sponsored by Lion Jeff Byrd; and David Wiggins, sponsored by Lion Charlie Childers (Lion Barry Willingham substituted for Lion Charlie, tonight).

Lion Chris introduced and called upon Past District Governor Jerry Stephens to talk about the history of Lionism, beginning with its founding by Mr. Melvin Jones and other businessmen in Chicago in 1917, continuing to the Lions' convention in 1925 with Helen Kellers challenge to be 'knights of the blind." Lion Chris followed with history of our Club, noting that we are 135 members strong, including our Branch

Club. Besides our biggest projects - the Cullman County Fair and our Fish & Ham dinner, but that we are always trying to grow our footprint in the community with support to such organizations as the Agriplex. The induction ceremony continued with sponsors pinning each new member with their Lions Club membership pins after making a pledge to support our Club and Lions International: sponsors were also pledged to assist the new members in transitioning to be great Lions. A round of applause was given to them all.

After Lion Chris Robinson first thanked the support shown to him through the ordeal of his wife's cancer treatment, he then introduced our speakers for tonight's program. First was Ms. Rachel Dawsey, Executive Director of the North Alabama Agriplex. Ms. Dawsey thanked the Club for its very generous contribution towards its capital campaign to raise \$2.4M for construction of an 8,525 sq. ft. community center on its current property. At this point she said that their funding campaign has so far achieved about 70% of its goal, and that construction plans are up for final review. After approval by

the Alabama Department of Construction Management, they will proceed with the project bid. This center will feature a fully equipped demonstration and teaching kitchen and home for the Cullman County Extension Office. The Agriplex works to preserve agricultural heritage, to educate and feed our citizens, and to grow a sustainable future.

Lion Chris Robinson next introduced our other speaker, tonight, Past District Governor and current District LICF (Lions International Club Foundation) Coordinator, Lion Jerry Stephens. Lion Stephens. Lion Chris was proud to point our that Lion Stephens was a fellow Michigan native, but that he is currently a database administrator at Athens State University. Lion Stephens stated that he has been very happy to have moved to Alabama, and he was grateful to our Club for its continued support to LCIF, which has been in operation for over fifty years. LCIF, in turn, has made several well-known contributions to our State following tornadoes and floods over the years. Its focus in several areas - service to youth, disaster relief, humanitarian disaster relief, cancer support, and hunger relief. Its total donation across the globe exceeds \$1.2 billion. He pointed out that 100% of donations go to helping people. All administrative costs, promotional materials, etc. are paid for by an endowment of Lions International, not from donated to LCIF. He pointed out that Lions Clubs, by themselves, cannot directly apply for an LCIF funding grant. The Clubs have to go through their Districts for a grant. LCIF can make emergency relief grants for \$10,000 that can be made almost immediately when a disaster strikes. North America and Canada have received 148 grants from July 2023 to December 2023. Across the world grants have been made for refugee needs. including survival and transitional needs for settlement in new communities. He also noted

hanks to our Clubs donations, our Club has over \$8,000 from LCIF that are available for a District impact grant request. It has to be used for humanitarian services and not for use to repair or build a club house or meals at meetings, etc. But it can be used to match funds that the Club already donated for humanitarian purposes in the community. He is working with Ms. Dawsey to secure a LCIF grant, matching our Club's contribution to the Agriplex.

Lion Jerry also talked about another LCIF program called the "Peace Poster Contest." It's for middle school kids. Any middle school can get a kit form Lions Club Internation explaining a poster competition rules and guidelines with the theme of "Peace without Limits." It's for kids from 11 to 13 years old, and a winner is selected from each State. The prize is \$250. Last year the Alabama's poster winner was from the city of Athens.

We all learned to appreciate how LCIF functions, its accomplishments, and what a great organization it is.
