Lion Ron Seybold introduced our speaker tonight, Ms. Rhonda McDavid, Executive Director SE Diabetes Education Services, Camp Seale Harris. Ms. McDavid began by telling of her first contact with anyone who had diabetes. It turned out to be her own son who was diagnosed when he was four years old.

Rhonda noted that our Club has been a sponsor of Camp Seale Harris for many years, and that Lion Ron and Lion Jerry Bonner have worked as volunteers with her during a week-end camp session. She reminded us that children cannot prevent this auto-immune disease, and they can not get a transplant. It's just something that they have to live with for the rest of their lives. She first heard of Camp Seale Harris when her son came home with its flyer and said that he wanted to go to this camp. She agreed to take him and that was where she was first introduced to Lions, who were helping at the camp. She found out about Lions other projects and its reputation as "Knights of the Blind, and about its partnership with Camp Seale Harris to help

children with diabetes, the number one cause of acquired blindness. Kids coming to the camp learn to be more consistent in checking their blood sugar – how to conquer carbohydrates – how to calculate how much insulin they're going to need. And for the first time, see 100 other kids just like them. Doing all those things before every meal, before every activity, before they go to bed, in the middle of the night, and they don't feel like they're the only one. All of a sudden, they've got a tribe. They realize that they can play football, be in the band, and still go to Boy Scout Camp, even if a nurse is not there. They learn that it's going to be all right! And the family learns the same thing.

Ms. McDavid showed a video that included many glowing testimonies from children who had participated in Camp Seal Harris Camp events. They explained how it encourages and empowers children with diabetes and their families to live well. Rhonda explained that the way most kids find out about the camp is through a brochure from their doctor's office. Also, every child diabetes patient at Children's Hospital is mailed one of these brochures. There is more than a single camp. In Alabama the organization is working to have a diabetes camp within two hours of anyone. Camps are scheduled year-round, with most individual kids' camp in the summer and with family camps in the fall and winter, along with one-day community camp programs. The range of duration for the camps goes from weeklong during the summer to weekend camps for families. They are also several overnight camps.

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This was a very informative and inspiring program presented by Ms. McDavid.
