Lion Jerry Smith is awaiting word from his surgeon in scheduling a procedure for heartvalve problems.

Lion Dewayne Wilson continues recovery at home after being admitted to Cullman Regional Hospital with RSV and severe coughing. President Lion Chris Brooks' wife, Betty, is back home after her surgery.

Lion Dave Gratz had some breathing problems and was taken to Brookwood Hospital in Birmingham for lung blood clots; his medical issues have stabilized, he is weak from his stay there, but he is improving.

Lion Randy Kraft gave us some details on his recent attendance at the Association of Alabama Fairs convention. He noted that the current 1st Vice President of this association will speak to us on March 18. He also informed us that our 2023 Fair got 2nd place for all Fairs in Alabama, coming in very close to 1st place Florence. He noted that Dr. Kira Sims from Cullman's Extension Office spoke at the convention about Cullman's Auburn Extension Office's support that it provides during our Fair. Most of the other Fair attendees were envious about that. Cullman will host the 2025 convention for this association in Building #1 at the Fairground. Also, Lion Randy was voted as the association's 1st Vice President, meaning that he is in line to be its President in two years.

Lion Steve Cartee began allowing Lions to sign for Ham & Fish Dinner tickets and gave us some detailed instructions on Fish & Ham ticket sales procedures. He reminded us that the ticket stub

should not be torn off, either by the seller or the buyer; the stub will be torn off for accounting purposes as it is exchanged for the buyer's dinner. Also, for proper accounting, Lion Steve wants to ensure that everyone who has tickets gets a receipt for ticket sale dollars/checks or for any unsold tickets as they are turned in to Lion Steve and his team; if you cannot wait for a receipt, put the dollars or checks or unsold tickets into an envelope upon which you have placed your name, the date, and details for the envelopes' contents (amount of money, amount # of tickets sold, and # of tickets being returned). Lion Steve will have a receipt prepared for you at the next Club meeting. Do not just lay cash/checks or tickets at Steve's table and walk away. Lion Steve pledged to be ready to issue tickets and receive proceeds starting at 5PM until everyone has been served at every Club meeting. He also said that everyone should count the number of tickets that they have received to make sure that number matches with what Lion Steve's records show.
