Program

Lion Randy Kraft enthusiastically introduced our speaker tonight, Col. Don Fallin. He talked a little about his initial steps in the US Army, saying that his Army affiliation was the best thing that ever happened to him, leading to a very satisfying life.



Col. Don Fallin give us an update on the progress and accomplishments of the Cullman Veterans Hall of Fame. Col. Fallin focus tonight was to brief us about his efforts in establishing the Cullman Veterans Hall of Fame organization with its purpose in recognizing veterans in Cullman County. He noted that there were many veterans among the Lions in attendance tonight, and that his organization was not focusing on any single group among generations of veterans. His organization intended to continue with the process that it started last year in recognizing 6 worthy veterans each year from within the Army, Air Force, Navy, and Marines. In its inaugural year of 2023 six veterans were honored with

plaques in their honor, prominently displayed in a high-traffic area on a wall of the courthouse and in Veterans Park. Each year, another 6 will be honored and the previous honoree names will be added to a plaque of running names. This past year, and going forward annually with another 6 honorees, they are to be honored with an induction ceremony at Veterans Park and with a celebratory dinner for them, along with their friends and their families; this past year there were 154 attendees. After plagues have been displayed over the year in the courthouse, they will be given to the honoree. Sponsors of this organization include the local American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, and many businesses, and community & business leaders. The Cullman Times and the Cullman Tribune featured articles about the Veterans Hall of Fame and the nominees.

Veterans Hall of Fame Nomination packets for consideration by members of the Hall of Fame selection committee are available at the VFW, the DAV, the American Legion, as well as the Cullman Savings Bank. Nominations can be made by a veteran's friends or family members who have knowledge of the military career of that veteran or in ways that a veteran has moved-on to contribute to the civilian community that would make them worthy of consideration. Col. Fallin noted that one problem with getting nominations is that often veterans are sometime reticent about talking about themselves and their military careers because of some those experiences were painful, although often heroic.

Col. Fallin has led his committee in honoring our veterans in an outstanding manner. We continue supporting these efforts.
