Our program tonight was presented by Lion Barry Willingham who discussed potentially adding a two story, 60' x 100' metal building to the Fairgrounds which would potentially include a meeting place for our Club, offices for the Fair Association and the Club, larger restroom accommodations (particularly for women), storage area, gates, and a new entrance way with exhibits on display. It could also tie-in to the theater, giving space for pageant judges and contestants. He also mentioned that perhaps this new building could be utilized by other civic organizations in Cullman and provide compensation to our Club or assistance with our projects.

Lion Barry said he plans to talk with several construction companies around Cullman next week to get a better idea of costs and options in pursuing this ambitious project. He would then discuss ideas with the both the Club and Fair BOD's and bring options to

review before the Club. If the decision is made to go forward, then the soonest we could proceed would be right after concluding our upcoming Fair.

Lion Delane also read a note with a donation from the late Lion Ron Seybold's mother for our love and support for her son. We also got thank-you notes from the Good Samaritan Clinic and Cullman Caring for Kids for our support.

Lion James Pinyan thanked everyone for their prayers for his wife, Lion Cindy, saying that she is doing great following her kidney surgery and is looking forward to getting back to work with our Club.

Lion Randy Kraft asked for program ideas and for help in bringing in speakers who would

be interesting and informative to our Club members. He also discussed the Alabama Association of Fairs annual convention at the Fairgrounds, February 19-22, assistance will be needed. He stressed how much the Association enjoyed this event here last year. He also mentioned what a great job Lion Cindy Pinyan did last year in decorating Bldg. # 1 for their activities. He also noted that our Club has members who are on the Association's Board of Directors. He is 1st Vice-President, Lion Bill Rue is 2nd Vice President, and Lion Brad Mitchell is 3rd Vice President.

Lion Craig Gadow talked about the Home Street Home meal at The Link 1/8/26 and invited the club to come and help if they could.
