Program

Lion Randy Kraft introduced Lion Jeff Lawson, a highly appreciated member of our Club and an investigator with the Cullman Sheriff's Department, as our speaker.

Lion Jeff, a former Marine, explained that he began his career in law enforcement several years ago in other local communities to include being school resource officer at Fairview, but was hired by Cullman's Sheriff and Lion, Matt Gentry, shortly after Matt was elected sheriff, and Lion Jeff is now an investigator for crimes against children and child trafficking. He says that one of the greatest dangers to children today comes from social media apps. Many parents are not aware of the danger that these apps can present, because individual phones were not that widespread when they were their children's age. Matt passed out a card with a listing from the DA's office of the 15 most prevalent of these apps (See page 3 of this newsletter). The most problematic in Jeff's opinion of these apps is one called "Snap Chat." Jeff says he gets search warrants signed by a Judge to search kid's phones after older adults have contacted them asking for pictures of themselves and their siblings and beginning the grooming process of taking advantage of them, getting user info and passwords. Jeff says that the abusers of

this app are all over the country and world. It is a money-making enterprise getting and selling this info to deviant persons. Parents are caught totally unaware of the danger impacting their child until damage is done. He says he can't tell how many cases he's seen where say --- a 25-year-old man manages to get a 12- or 13-year-old girl's Snapchat log-in data or phone number, or some other social media login data. Many kids today never disconnect from people at school or some perpetrator that gets their information and talks for 10 solid hours. Kids by themselves in the middle of the night can make bad decisions. Like this 19year-old kid, a quarterback in Florida who lost his scholarship due to a couple of child porn photos on his cell phone. Once someone gets your data, it usually means they can lookup exactly where vou live.

One other app that Jeff mentioned was Omegle, where you can be connected to <u>anybody in the</u> <u>world</u> – someone who makes promises of travel, meeting cool people, making big money, etc.

Lion Jeff noted that in today's world many mistakes and bad judgement are recorded, whether it be photo, video, or email. It's not like anything we experienced as kids. Very frequently people are getting roasted for something they said or did as teenagers or college students or even younger – but it shows up on social media, and it's like it happened yesterday.

In the aftermath of some kid making a mistake, Jeff said that he has met with families where the whole family is broken. And they are ashamed – kids do not want to go back to school – they don't even want to show their face.

As a counter to these social media dangers, Lion Jeff noted that parents can get an app that allows them to monitor everything that their children see

or communicates on their cell phones. Jeff definitely recommended that parents get such an app and also collect their childrens phones at bedtime for charging their batteries and making sure that phones are not being used after bedtime.

Investigator Jeff Lawson probably opened a few parents' eyes tonight, regarding the protection of their children and grandchildren from dangers lurking within the social media world. Much appreciated information.
