Program

For our program tonight we had Lion Jerry Bonner on hand to emcee the formal induction of our latest crop of new Lions into the Club.

Lion Jerry Bonner began by telling of the beginning of Lions International 106 years ago by Chicago businessman, Melvin Jones, and then how his small local organization grew into the world's largest service organization, dedicated to worldwide service to humanity. Lions International Clubs now number 4,906 and are located in 110 countries. Total membership has exceeded 1,396,000. Our Cullman Lions Club has been especially significant in its contribution to Lionism in Alabama, providing 10 Lions Club District Governors and 5 Presidents of Alabama Lions Sight, since its inception with Lion Blair Powell as its first President in 1954. During the great depression in 1931, an Alabamian, Lion Roderick Beddow was Lions International President and personally provided funds to keep the organization solvent. In the past 8 years our Club has donated over \$785,000 to charities, mainly local. So far this year, it has donated over \$102,000 to charities.

Following Lion Jerry's remarks, he led the swearing-in of new members as they pledged to uphold the tenants of Lionism and to support the Club with their attendance, commitment to assisting in Club projects, and serving as a member or chairman of the Club's committees or as officers when asked. This was following by awarding certificates of Lions Club membership and by sponsors pinning new members with their Lions Club International pins.

Other Business

Lion Gordon Boyd will require a stay for rehabilitation at either Folsom or Hanceville Nursing Homes after being hospitalized for spinal stenosis; but he is feeling better. Lion David Goodwin is feeling better, following his last radiation treatment. It was noted that Lion Howard Perry had been absent from the last few meetings; several Lions had tried to call, but his number
