Program

Lion Chris Robinson introduced our speakers tonight, representing "Bikers Against Child Abuse (BACA), Hurricane Creek Chapter," Ms. Kathy Sweatmon (biker road name -- Kit Kat) and her fellow biker, Slushie, both of whom rode up on their motorcycles and wearing their Club vests; they are both local natives.

Both Kit Kat and Slushie, and their dedication to help abused children was apparent. Slushie, who is the biker club President, spoke first and noted that BACA is a non-profit organization and has a sister chapter in south Alabama; there are chapters in every US State, except Rhode Island, and in 17 countries around the world. BACA's mission statement is as follows:

"BACA exists with the intent to create a safer environment for abused children. We exist as a body of bikers to empower children not to feel afraid of the world in which they live. We stand ready to lend support to our wounded friends by involving them in conjunction with local and state officials who are already in place to protect children. We desire to send a clear message to all involved with the abused child that this child is part of our organization, and that we are prepared to lend our physical and emotional support to them by affiliation and our physical presence. We stand at the ready to shield these children from further abuse. We do not condone the use of violence or physical force in any manner, however, if circumstances arise such that we are the only obstacle preventing a child rom further abuse, we stand ready to be that obstacle."

BACA was started by a Licensed Clinical Social Worker Supervisor who was also a faculty member at Brigham Young University. He was also a biker who noted how his bike seemed to pave the way in connecting with the abused kids that he worked with.

Slushie said that the kids they work with are given a biker jacket with their own road name embroidered on it, and they are given rides. The BACA team forms a bond with these kids and makes it known that anytime they need help or get scared or worried, they can depend on them to be there. BACA even shows up at Court hearing to show support and lend confidence to kids when they testify.

Kit Kat then spoke, explaining that she is the child, chapter, and court liaison for her BACA chapter, mainly serving as the first point of contact for BACA involvement in child abuse cases. She pointed out one big difference in BACA from all other local agencies like law enforcement, the courts, and city/county government involved in child abuse cases. That difference is that they are all paid employees;

BACA consists entirely of volunteers. The chapter accounts for every penny of donations, insuring that 100% is spent for the benefit of the kids it serves. Also, many of its members were child abuse victims, themselves. The two BACA chapters of Alabama provide service to all counties of the State. Two BACA members are assigned as a referred child's primary contact with support, based on the child's individual need and remain in close contact as appropriate.

Law enforcement and other agencies cannot physically provide protection or comfort 24 hours a day. BACA contributes to meeting this shortfall and is certainly a great asset to our community. Kit Kat mentioned a fund raiser coming up on September 13th which is a <u>pig roast</u> (smoked-shoulder) dinner at a cost of \$35; orders need to be in by August 31st. Last year they sold 300. If you contact them, they will deliver or you can pick up. Meetings are open to the public (2nd Sunday of the month @ 2:30PM, just off junction of Hwy 69 east of mile marker 251 and County Rd 1507.
