Colonel in the Army, earning a Bronze Star and other medals; she is now a manager in aviation missile technology projects at Redstone Arsenal, and has volunteered in many community activities such as assistant Girl Scout Master. She said that our Fair was not only special because of the many charitable donations it produced but also because of the positive bonding effects, allowing local families and the entire community to experience with their attendance; she also noted that over 50,000 visitors came to our Fair. She also highlighted some of the Clubs other accomplishments. 1st Vice District Governor Bright gave us an uplifting presentation.
