Donations were approved for the Cullman Veterans Hall of Fame (it was noted that the first American soldier drafted for WW I and the last American soldier killed in WW II was from Cullman), the Wreaths for Americans organization (for veterans interred in Cullman's local cemeteries), and Alabama Lions Sight.

Lion Richard Gurley reported on the status of his committee for developing a slate of candidates for the Fair Association Board of Directors (BOD). He said that he is prepared to announce this slate at the next meeting on Nov. 6th, and that the Club could then vote at the Nov. 20th meeting.

Lion President reported on one item from the most recent District 34A cabinet meeting that he was unaware of: And that is that when ever a Club donates to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), it gets credit towards a grant that can be claimed. Based on our Club's past donations, there is \$8,000 from LCIF awaiting our grant request for one of our supported organizations, such as the North Alabama Agriplex. He also noted that LCIF has contributed \$10,000 within 24 hours to our State whenever there has been a major catastrophe like, such as a bad tornado.

New Lion Jimmy Horton attended his first meeting tonight. He stated that he graduated from Eva High School and attended Wallace State. He works at the Cullman Funeral Home with Lion Steve Rodgers. He has 3 children, 6 grandchildren, and 4 great-grandchildren.
